- c. The manuscript must include an abstract with some key words, an introduction, main body, conclusion and references.
- d. The abstract should be no more than 250 words.
- e. The Manuscript (**In-text citation**, **references** and other technical things) must be formatted according **APA Style**. For detailed instructions, please visit <a href="http://cqr.um.edu.my">http://cqr.um.edu.my</a>.
- f. Each article should be a maximum of 7,000 words including reference notes.
- g. The text of the manuscript should contain no information that might identify an author.
- h. A book review should be no more than 1000 words.
